This training ensures that individuals meet the OSHA requirement for a qualified rigger or signal person per the OSHA Crane Standards 1926.1400. Upon completion of the course and a passing test score, each attendee will receive a wallet card recognizing the individual has completed Rigging & Signaling training.

Training Outline

The training will cover the following areas:

- Understanding cranes and the impact of proper rigging and signaling requirements
- Understanding the OSHA guidelines for qualified rigger and qualified signal person
- Sling Operations rigging
- · Calculating and understanding the weight of a lift
- Knowing the safety requirements and how to manage lifting loads in a safe manner
- Proper signaling for cranes, including hand signals, voice signals, and special signals

Training Requirements

Each person completing the training will be given a written quiz on proper rigging, rigging safety, and crane signaling. A <u>75% or higher</u> grade is required to receive a "Qualified Rigger" and "Qualified Signaler" validation.

To receive a "Qualified Signal Person" qualification, each person will take an oral exam that covers hand signals and verbal commands.

The class will be taught in English; students must read, write, and comprehend English.

Re-training is recommended every three years but not required by OSHA.
